Safety Advisory Committee Report to Academic Senate

February 14th, 2024

Announcements:

- Stepping stones strip from north to south separating the concreate from CSS to PAC causing a tripping and fall hazard is scheduled for repair the week of March 25-29 over Spring Break.
- Emergency Response Plan lockdown training exercise is planned for March. More information to come.

Completed Items:

- Charge review is completed and has been approved by Academic Senate on November 8, 2023 and College Council on December 1, 2023.
- Humanities outdoor lighting issue has been resolved.
- Completed in service training for Slip, Trips, and Falls for food service and installing slip resistant mats where needed.

Upcoming Items:

- College Safety is currently collecting data on creating a Police Department on Campus. It's currently in the information gathering stage. There are approximately 120 colleges and approximately 50 have sworn officers on their campus. Public Safety must wait for BPD to respond and cannot detain suspects for questioning without probable cause or evidence. This can potentially allow a suspect to go free without justice for the victim and not stop future crimes from the suspect. College Safety will be meeting with other groups on campus including the Student Government Association to gain feedback and input.
- Night walks are being conducted by College Safety for Campus and Center Locations to assess any lighting/safety issues.
- Bollards to prevent vehicles on campus interior. M&O has the project. This project has been modified to change from bollards to a gate type infrastructure to allow easier access to interior campus when needed. Calvin is working to secure funding. Budget is pending.
- Investigation into food service kitchen/prep area floors to mitigate slip, trips, and falls.
- Review of emergency response procedures. Rough draft has been received from outside vendor and are working through it with CC and PC.
