Online Education Resource (OER) Liaison Report to Academic Senate

Goals: (ongoing)

- 1. Create two degrees that students can take as fully OER/ZTC
- 2. Expand our General Education offerings to give students flexibility in their ZTC choices
- 3. Educate faculty on OER resources available to them and how to us these in the classroom

Announcements:

- The bookstore website ECampus reports the use of OER was 350 courses Fall 2023 and 434 for Spring 2024 = 24% INCREASE!
 - ACTION: more faculty adopt OER
- Office Inst. Effectiveness reports the use of ZTC was 283 courses Fall 2023 and 348 for Spring 2024 = 22% increase.
 - ACTION: more faculty identify ZTC on the Class Schedule page (link was provided on the BAC email from Michael McNellis)
- <u>CCC Low-Cost textbook definitions</u>. Reminder, KCCD is \$50. The OER Student Survey concluded that 56% of students felt \$20, 21% thought \$30, 12% thought \$40, 11% thought \$50.

Completed Items:

- The OER team conducted a Student Survey through Canvas. There were over 2100 responses. Results are as follows:
 - O Q. Have you taken an OER Class?

1383 YES 63%

808 NO 37%

Q. Can you tell us which class you used a free textbook?

- Too expensive
- Feels like a scam
- Only take four classes a semester because they can't afford to pay for textbooks for five classes
- Don't understand how the textbook industry works
