# Rationale for Proposal for Change in Distance Education Review Processes

## 1. Identify the key Issue, novel situation, challenge, problem, etc.

One correction from the Senate President's Report from yesterday - The random selection of fully online courses to be checked using the <u>ACCJC Distance Education Pilot Rubric</u> will be of Fall 2024 courses, not Spring 2025. Spring 2025 will only be evaluated if the college does not receive a passing score for Fall 2024 courses.

### 2. Provide underlying <u>rationale</u> for addressing the issue.

Up to 50 fully online (asynchronous) Fall 2024 courses will be randomly selected for review using the Distance Education Pilot Rubric by ACCJC peer review group.

## 3. Include any relevant background and institutional history.

According to their charge, <u>AIQ</u> is a standing committee that "ensure[s] accreditation is an ongoing process...and review[s] and monitor[s]... accreditation recommendations."

### 4. Anticipate opposing arguments.

Do nothing different and wait to see what happens.

### 5. Articulate possible solution(s), highlighting support for the most desirable outcome.

- Ask AIQ to guide and inform an approach which may include holding Flex workshops, office hours, partnering with Academic Technology to facilitate voluntary selfevaluations, etc.
- Form a Task Force to the above items.
- Encourage self-reviews by department, discipline, or individual.
