Accreditation & Core Inquiries

Core inquiries are requests for supplemental evidence to either validate the institution's alignment with standards or develop commendations for areas of excellence.

Core Inquiry: Regular and Substantive Interaction in Distance Education (**RSI**)

Preliminary sample of **50 online sections** → **Did not meet 85% minimum standard**

 If addressed: Recommendation for Improvement

 If ignored: **Recommendation for Compliance** → **Accreditation risk**



Actions Taken So Far

1. Academic Technology **workshops** scheduled to assist faculty in meeting RSI standards.
2. Reduced **online sections to a maximum of 45 seats** since Spring 2025.
3. An Academic Technology Faculty member assigned to **review sample** against RSI rubric.
4. Distance Education Taskforce working on the creation of **DE Handbook**.
5. Discussions on Peer Online Course Review (**POCR**) **Certification Model**.
6. Encouraging additional **EDUC31NC courses for Summer 2025**.



How You Can Help

1. Send **weekly announcements** on Canvas about course content and learning outcomes.
2. Provide meaningful **feedback** in the Comment Box in SpeedGrader on most assignments.
3. Use the “**Message Students Who**” feature on Canvas to follow-up with students who miss assignments.
4. Include **Canvas discussions on a predictable and regular basis**. Comment once or twice in a discussion.
5. Complete **Starfish Progress reports**.
6. Clearly state **communication policies** not only in your syllabus but on your Canvas Homepage/welcome module and stick to it.
