ASCCC Spring 2025 Plenary and Resolutions update

The Spring 2025 ASCCC Plenary session featured the review and voting on numerous resolutions across topics such as curriculum, faculty development, equity, and governance. The voting process went smoothly with the vast majority of resolutions passing without significant opposition, reflecting broad consensus on the issues raised.

The most noteworthy aspect of the Plenary was not the content of the resolutions themselves, but the significant changes at the leadership level. All the new officers were elected, marking a substantial shift in the Academic Senate's leadership team. President and Vice President ran unopposed, with all other positions having many candidates. It will be interesting to observe how these new leaders step into their roles and navigate the evolving landscape of higher education policy and faculty representation.

In summary, while the resolutions were generally non-controversial, the changes in leadership are what stood out most; it is nice to see a lot of new faces running for officer positions and local area representation.

A draft of my notes from the resolution voting process has been submitted; however, one page of notes is missing and a few resolution results are still unconfirmed. Once the finalized, perfected resolution packet is released (expected within the next week), I will forward it to all faculty for full review.
