## **Minutes**

Approval of 1/29/24 Minutes

Chairs Report: Grace & Jessica

Kimberly Bligh and Jessica made presentations to the Senate and college council about fraud mitigation. Todd Coston will now be taking over as lead on fraudulent students. On February 5<sup>th</sup>, the district launched the use of ID Me to verify student identity when they register.

Jessica: Before Christmas break, all deans were tasked with identifying fraudulent students in their class enrollments and worked with IT to develop an algorithm to identify fraudulent registrations. Findings so far have resulted in 2% false positives. Students identified as fraudulent will be put "on hold" from receiving financial aid but they will be able to keep their seat in class.

Think mobile is attempting to identify fraudulent students and will run a test case. We will supply 1000 student registrations in total and half will be legitimate then the results will determine their accuracy. Depending on the results, could consider a contract with them. We may also try a pilot with LexisNexis that is funded by the State Chancellor's office, and this should run over this year.

At the board meeting Jessica attended, the board members voiced concern over the fraudulent registrations and wanted to know what actions we are taking to reduce. Jessica presented our survey results at the Senate and Eboard and will schedule with the College Council.

Grace is training to be certified to work on BC committee webpage.

Substantive Change Manual - February 2024 (accjc.org)

Substantive change goals from ACCJC on the topic of distance Ed; half or more of the total student population need to be registered in distance Ed.

Our statistics: 58% of students are taking distance Ed. 2023/24-34% classes are offered as distance Ed.

Enrollments for Southwest up from 25% from last spring and Delano up by 50% from last Spring.

Should have a draft next meeting to start making forms.

Would like to plan a way to increase program review submissions.

Kristin: we are in a holding pattern because the district is working on their strategic directions and the Deputy Chancellor is working on a calendar. Jessica: The new president will be joining soon, and we should consider stopping work on creating new strategic directions and instead, work on completing the current initiatives. Collect data and evidence to support a completed initiative.
