After reading the informational items (course title, course description, course objectives), evaluate the quality of the student learning outcomes listed by following the checklist below. Make sure that the course is a CNN course (usually, a number starting with a C, followed by 100- or 200- style number; e.g., STATS C1000. Open up the current [Course Outlines of Records Guidelines](#) available on the CCCC Website.

<p>Read over the SLOs submitted: does each statement match EXACTLY to the guidelines listed above? Typos are to be allowed if they are part of the original document, down to the numbering of the SLOs.</p>		
<p>Do the course objectives and SLOs match exactly?</p>		
<p>Optional: Do you see any typos, mistakes, or any other issues you would normally consider? Please note them as commentary, stating that they should not be changed at this time. Do not correct for Bloom's Taxonomy nor try to improve the grammar and word choice. Making comments of such things will help when expected guideline modifications occur.</p>		
<p>Are the SLOs mapped to ILOs, and, if applicable, to GELOs?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Check the Assessment Mapping section below the Learning Outcomes section to see if the mapping has been completed. If there is mapping, verify that it has been fully completed. If each SLO is not mapped to at least one ILO, make a comment. ● To find out if a course should map to GELOs, look at the Transferability & Gen. Ed. Options section to see whether the course is a GE course and needs GELO mappings—the specific GE area will be listed. If there is no GE area listed, this course does not need GELO mappings.
