#### A RESOLUTION

#### **Turner Initiative**

- 1 Whereas, Bakersfield College provides a vibrant and inclusive learning environment that
- 2 actively empowers students from diverse economic, cultural, and educational backgrounds,
- 3 ensuring access to Associate and Baccalaureate degrees, certificates, valuable workplace
- 4 skills, and comprehensive preparation for transfer to four-year institutions<sup>12</sup>; and

- Whereas, Bakersfield College fosters a rigorous and supportive educational atmosphere that
- 7 emphasizes equity and diversity, recognizing that incorporating multiple perspectives not

2	nuanced understanding of the complexities of our global society <sup>34</sup> ; and

4	Whereas, Bakersfield College is deeply committed to the holistic well-being and success of
5	all community members, and actively cultivates an inclusive campus culture where all
6	students—regardless of their backgrounds—can thrive academically, socially, and
7	personally <sup>56</sup> ; and
8	
9	Whereas, research indicates that providing educational opportunities to formerly
10	incarcerated individuals significantly decreases recidivism rates, thereby enhancing public
11	safety and contributing positively to the well-being of California's communities, underscoring
12	the transformative power of education <sup>78</sup> ; and
13	
14	Whereas, formerly incarcerated students often demonstrate remarkable academic potential,
15	frequently achieving higher grades and graduation rates compared to their peers, with

1	numerous studies confirming that education plays a crucial role in reducing the likelihood of
2	reoffending, thus benefiting individuals and society as a whole91011; and
3	
4	Whereas, Bakersfield College proudly hosts the Rising Scholars Program, which provides
5	incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals with critical access to higher education,
6	promoting both personal and academic growth; this program has demonstrated success in
7	increasing educational attainment, fostering personal development, and significantly
8	reducing recidivism rates among its participants <sup>12</sup> ; and
9	
10	Whereas, formerly incarcerated individuals often encounter substantial challenges in
11	demonstrating community ties, due to the constraints imposed by their prior incarceration;
12	successful parole plans are essential for establishing these connections and supporting their
13	reintegration into society <sup>1314</sup> ; and
14	
15	Whereas, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilitates the transfer
16	of parolees to other states where they can receive family support, highlighting the critical
17	importance of such support in achieving successful reintegration into communities and

4	a)	that the Bakersfield College Student Government Association strongly urges the
5		administration to recognize parole plans as legitimate evidence of intent to remain in
6		California for the purposes of establishing California residency and qualifying for in-state
7		tuition;
8	b)	that the Bakersfield College Student Government Association recommends that the
9		college administration collaborate with local community organizations and policy makers
10		to advocate for the recognition of parole plans as part of the broader effort to provide
11		formerly incarcerated individuals with equal access to higher education opportunities;
12		and
13	Be	it further resolved by the Senate of the Bakersfield College Student Government
14	Associa	tion,
15	a)	that the Bakersfield College Student Government Association calls on the California
16		community college system to adopt policies that acknowledge parole plans as valid
17		documentation of community ties, ensuring that formerly incarcerated students are not
18		unfairly disadvantaged in their pursuit of education and career advancement;
19	b)	that the Bakersfield College Student Government Association calls on the California
20		Community College system to commit to continuing advocacy for policies that support
21		access to higher education for all students, regardless of their background, in order to
22		foster an inclusive and equitable academic environment.
23	Be	it further resolved by the Senate of the Bakersfield College Student Government
24	As	sociation,
25	a)	That this resolution shall be forwarded to Bakersfield College President Mr. Jerry
26		Fliger, the Office of Admissions and Records, and the SSCCC.
