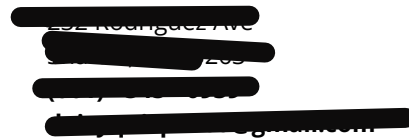

A RESOLUTION

Authorizing Remote Attendance under AB 1855 for
Bakersfield College Student Government Association Meetings

1 *WHEREAS*, current law under SB 707 Durazo and the Ralph M. Brown Act and Assembly Bill
2449 authorizes

2 an “eligible legislative body” to use alternative teleconferencing for meetings without complying
3 with the notice, agenda, and access requirements for traditional teleconferencing after following
4 procedures specified by statute; and

5 *WHEREAS*, on September 14, 2024, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Assembly Bill 1855,
6 Alternate Teleconferencing Provisions for California Community Student Legislative Body, including
Student Government and Student-Run Organizations

7 *WHEREAS*, Assembly Bill 1855 (AB 1855, Arambula) authorizes student body associations
8 and other student-run organizations at California Community Colleges to utilize teleconferencing
9 without disclosing participants’ physical locations, provided that two-thirds of the organization’s
10 legislative body approves and the Board of Trustees adopts a resolution authorizing its use; and

1 **WHEREAS**, AB 1855 still ensures transparency and public participation by requiring
2 teleconferenced meetings to provide call-in and internet-based access, with clear agenda
3 instructions for public engagement and a provision that no further action shall be taken if public
4 access is disrupted; and

5 **WHEREAS**, AB 1855 includes critical privacy protections for vulnerable individuals,
6 including but not limited to:

- 7 • Persons with disabilities requiring accommodation under the Americans with Disabilities
8 Act (ADA);
- 9 • Individuals under the age of 18;
- 10 • Incarcerated persons;
- 11 • Individuals under protective court orders or participating in confidential programs; and
- 12 • Caregivers whose responsibilities necessitate remote participation; and

13 **WHEREAS**, the bill mandates that a quorum of the student-run organization's members be
14 physically present at a public location within the community college district, while allowing exempt
15 individuals to count toward quorum remotely; and

16 **WHEREAS**, the Bakersfield College Student Government Association (BCSGA) supports
17 expanding access to meetings through alternative teleconferencing to promote inclusivity and
18 accessibility, and increase student participation; and

19 **WHEREAS**, the Kern Community College District Board of Trustees must authorize BCSGA
20 meetings to use alternative teleconferencing provisions in accordance with AB 1855 as it relates
21 to notice, agenda, and public participation; and

22 **WHEREAS**, the adoption of this resolution ensures that all virtual participation adheres to
23 transparency, public access, and quorum requirements while enhancing engagement with
24 students who may face barriers to in-person attendance; and

25 **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Bakersfield College Student Government
26 Association formally requests the Board of Trustees adopt a resolution authorizing student-run
27 organizations to utilize the teleconferencing provisions outlined in AB 1855, effective immediately
28 through December 31, 2026

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that by implementing these provisions, Bakersfield College
2 formally affirms its commitments to accessible, equitable, and effective student leadership; and

3 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution shall be distributed to the Kern
4 Community College Board of Trustees, the Office of Student Life, and any other relevant
5 stakeholders to facilitate its adoption and implementation. ◦
