Each entity involved is sponsoring different portions of the event, coming to SGA and the Levan Institute seeking atleast \$1000.

Linares: I do think this is a good thing for our students, I know student orgs like MESA would attend and there is a large hispanic population on campus so I can see a big turnout.

Ayala: This event will be in Spanish, the author will present in Spanish and there will be English translators via closed-captioning. Will be providing books, and will play music from the war. Worked with performing arts, planning a mini live concert leading into the conversation. Funding is a little different for DSS. We try to include it within our curriculum, and the entire department must be behind it- in this case, foreign language.

Anguiano: If we approve this, can we encourage professors as well/

Ayala: Definitely, you should.

Saldivar: The event will be in the evening, because it does need to be dark.

Ayala: The pool has very explicit rules around swim attire, it is easier to just back that up and make that claim so long as we advertise those details as well. We can do a WuFoo form with pay, so it explicitly lists all the necessary details.

Saldivar: What were we thinking for food?

Linares: The last time we discussed, we said sandwiches. Already made. We can do a vegetarian option.

Ayala: I'd imagine theres no food at all allowed in the pool. So we have to take this conversation back to events. The requirements should be on the BC website. Another consideration is, to do a pool party with music and people swimming, as its cheaper— as a backup option if the movie is too expensive.

Saldivar: Should that change the time?

Linares: Maybe 4-7, towards the end of the day. If food is still allowed, maybe snacks.

Arafah: Drinks and snacks, maybe lemonade.

Anguiano: Water too.

Saldivar: Maybe charcuterie boards from the dining commons.

Diaz: Fruit as well.

Linares: Keep in mind the utensils and plates, and cleanup.

Saldivar: Movie or not?

Senators: Not. Would be easier to regulate.

Saldivars: We can use wristbands for regulation.
