

### Discussion:

a. Action item approval of \$1,000 from TA100-Student Organizations for the Sexuality and Gender Acceptance Club's SOF Grant programing request for the screening of "Real Boy" on Thursday, March 16th 2017 at 6:00 pm-9:00 pm at Bakersfield College for 50-200 students. Senator Salcido moved to open discussion on Item 8.a, Seconded by Senator Montero Garcia Discussion:

SAGA Club: We wish to request a SOF grant in order to pay for showing the movie as well as the traveling fees of several speakers who will be presenting at a panel for the movie "Real Boy." The movie is about a transgender boy and his transition and dives into themes of gender identity and sexuality. We are asking for \$1,000 in SOF Grant, the showing of the film will cost \$500 and another \$500 will be used to bring the director to BC to speak at a panel. This event is for the community as a whole, so both the students and the public are welcomed.

Senator Cortez: What exactly are the panels for?

*SAGA Club*: This is for people who wish to ask questions about the movie. The director of the film will be there if we can be their travel fees, so people can ask the director directly anything they wish about the movie and what it tackles.

Senator Rodriguez. Do you believe that through showing this movie and having a panel afterwards, people will be informed enough to the point that they'll be able to understand the topic of transgenderism better? Especially for those who do not fully understand the topic yet still want to be inclusive on campus?

SAGA Club. Yes, be showing this movie we believe it will help in the effort to expand inclusivity at BC.

Senator Montero Garcia: What is PAX West?

Senator Limaco: To answer that questions, it is a sound and lighting company.

Senator Salcido: How will your club be advertising this event?

SAGA Club: We will mostly be using flyers and Facebook to advertise, as well as reaching out to third parties to spread the word on our event.
