President's Report to College Council

October 21, 2016

Enrollments:

The October 5, 2016 report from the Office of Institutional Research shows that BC's Fall 2016 enrollment is 6.2% (415.9 FTES) above Fall 2015. The district as a whole is at 5.4% (500.6 FTES) enrollment growth Fall 2016 compared to Fall 2015. Out of the district's growth of 500.6 FTES, 83.1% (415.9 FTES) of the growth occurred at BC.

BC's productivity ratio decreased from 17.2 FTES/FTEF to 17.0 FTES/FTEF comparing Fall 2015 to Fall 2016, but is still within our target range on the Renegade Scorecard. The district wide productivity ratio from Fall 2015 to Fall 2016 decreased from 16.5 FTES/FTEF to 16.1 FTES/FTEF.

Highlights since my last report:

Here are some highlights on activities since my last report:

September 6, 2016: Grand opening of the Aera Stem Success Center

September 14, 2016: Invited speaker to an American Association of Colleges and Universities (AACU) conference. *Balancing the Quality, Completion, Equity Agenda in Poicy and Practice*. Here is an excerpt of my remarks:

Learning is a state of being – physical being. More than that, it is an ecological gift – we are all hard-wired to learn. Current research on childhood education like the Thirty Million Words Initiative (<u>http://thirtymillionwords.org</u>), makes it clear that learning is innate, and that not learning is the result of deprivation.

Biologically speaking, learning is making new neural pathways, physically creating new networks that make meaning, and pruning the pathways and networks that are not meaningful. As they say, neurons that "fire together wire together". Thinking reinforces thinking. I was thinking how the academy can become distracted by the profusion of information, but not enough thinking. This is a fundamental shift in education. Our brains evolved to nurture, gather, mine, imagine, and make meaning, based on environmental clues and scant information – now we must learn to cope with and prune a flood of "information".....

If Learning is physiology, then completion is sociology. What do I mean by that? Completion of a degree is the solidifying of a social synapse, a communication to the individual and to society that the individual has "learned" something and has certain skills and abilities. So it is a transactional currency, a social proxy or marker of learning.

Metaphorically speaking, completion that "fires together wires together". Carnegie units wire together in a cluster of courses that wire together into a program. I won't fully defend the Carnegie unit, but even though it has been characterized as an imposter of true learning, a mere token, I see it as a functional element of social learning a way to fire and wire together. Social structures of completion, of wiring together, rather than being discarded, can be leveraged to continue to promote the quality of the learning.
