On March 30, 2017, The Opportunity Institute and Bakersfield College partnered to host the first meeting to Serve Our Formerly Incarcerated Students.

The Renewing Communities Project works with colleges and universities, in addition to community organizations and the courts, to serve formerly and currently incarcerated individuals with the goal of enrolling them in college and making those them productive members of society and reduce the rate of recidivism.

Mayor Karen Goh welcomed community partners and members of the justice system including CDCR, Lerdo Jail, and the Parole Dept. 1st Annual Public Health Hackathon Takes Place at BC

Local students from both BC and CSUB came together in collaboration to create teams for the first annual BC Public Health Hackathon. This interdisciplinary competition engaged students and professionals from various backgrounds in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics and non-STEM fields, local centers of higher education, community, industry, and the public. First place was awarded to "Down with Depression" for developing an app that gives accurate information on how to fight depression. Second place was awarded to "Safe Searches" for a website developed to give LGBTQ communities a resource to find supportive doctors. And 3rd place went to "MentalMapper's" for an app that stimulates brain activity to improve cognitive functions for patients with neurological disorders. Events like these are a venue for students to show their skills and give back to the community.
