Over the past two weeks, the ISER team has met multiple times, has hosted the second Campus-Wide engagement Accreditation Forum [on Standard II] at both campuses, and continues to work to guarantee that all of the team documents will be in the right condition for the lead editor to begin work in early December.

**Engagement Plan: Emailed Communications**

Since the last meeting, the Accreditation ISER team has consulted with the Engagement Communications Team to help them craft an appropriate third Engagement Email, which will be delivered on October 25<sup>th</sup>.

The communications involved in crafting this third email has occurred very smoothly, demonstrating the abilities of our colleagues to harmoniously work together.

**Engagement Plan: Committee presentations.**

We have continued to customize our PowerPoint presentations for committee meetings, and our Engagement Team has presented these two more committees since College Council last met.
