BC Public Safety

Keeping students, faculty, staff, and our community safe is an ongoing and constant effort. Bakersfield College is an open institution and we are an integral part of the community. We know that with awareness, preparation, and practice of drills, the work of our Public Safety Department can save lives. Here are some of our routine practices:

- BC participates in the Great California Shakeout each year where we conduct a campus wide evacuation and activate BC's Incident Command Center
- Fire alarm drills for all buildings each semester
- Six emergency response classes each semester to train employees on what to do in the event of an emergency
- Six to nine Active Shooter Response Training presentations each semester for the college community
- Active Shooter Response Training for new faculty at orientation
- Presence at all new student orientations to review Department of Public Safety operations and services and provides overviews of Title IX, Violence Against Women's Act (VAWA) and the Clery Act.
- Sharing safety tips each semester to all students, staff, and faculty via emails.
- Provides free First Aid/CPR/AED certification training to all students, staff and faculty each semester.
- Upon requests, Public Safety attends individual campus department meetings to discuss how to respond to the following scenarios; (1) Hostile students, visitors, staff, (2) Response to medical aid situations in the work place (3)Active Shooter Response to specific department areas/buildings (4)Fire alarm drills and (5) Any topic they may wish to discuss related to safety concerns.
