Enrollment Update

The June 6th report from the District Research Office shows student headcount for Summer 2018 has increased 14.6% and current FTES is 1,786 (+12%) compared to this point in time last year. The fall headcount increased 3.6% and FTES is at 5,918 (+6%).

In 1913, BC began with thirteen students and in 2018 on May 11th, the College celebrated the largest graduation in history. With more than 2,000 students eligible for graduation, nearly half of them walked the stage and Memorial Stadium was packed with more family and friends than ever before to celebrate these accomplishments. The Class of 2018 included the first Baccalaureate graduates in Industrial Automation, the first graduates of the Wonderful Dual Enrollment program, the first graduates of the Kern Promise, and the first graduate to receive a Public Health Associates degree.

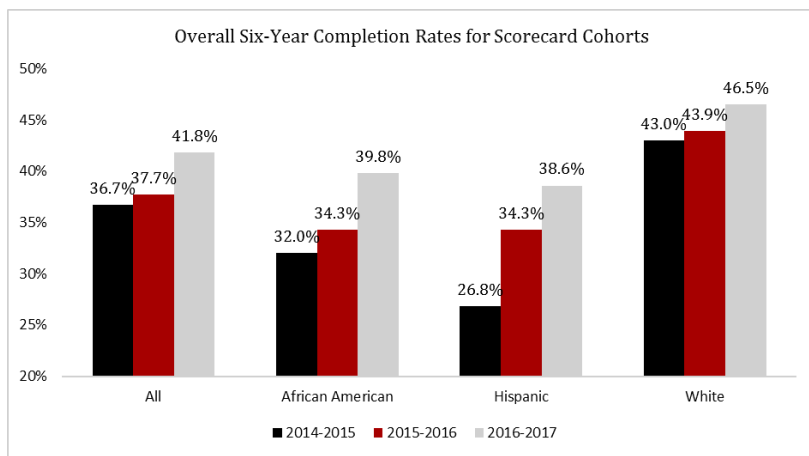


BC Selected as Recipient of \$2.3 Million

Bakersfield College has been selected by the state Chancellor's Office as one of 11 community colleges to be awarded a share of \$20 million to further development and implementation of programs that strengthen student success.

For the innovative design and mapping of transfer pathways through technology and systems integration, Bakersfield College was named the recipient of \$2,300,000. The funding aims to advance implementation of high-tech, high-touch guided pathways strategies that ensure all students have access to fully mapped and well-designed transfer pathways no matter the point from which they are accessing the institution.

During a national meet organized by the great Athletic Director Gil Bishop, Kansas State sophomore Jim Ryun blew away the existing world record in the mile with a blazing 3:51.1 on June 23, 1967.

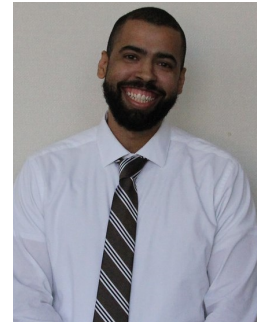
