The Accreditation & Institutional Quality (AIQ) committee met most recently on October 23rd, from 3:30 to 5:00 p.m. at the BC Southwest Campus. During the school year, we meet on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month. The charge of AIQ reads:

1. Ensure accreditation is an on-going process by guiding preparation of the self-evaluation, midterm, and follow-up reports.
2. Review and monitor collection of evidence and progress on Actionable Improvement Plans, accreditation recommendations, and institutional effectiveness indicators.
3. Inform, engage, and involve the college community in accreditation and institutional effectiveness.
4. Review and monitor evaluation activities to ensure they result in integrated, meaningful, and sustained college improvement.

AIQ will close the Fall Accreditation Survey at 5pm on Friday, November 2nd. Those who have not yet completed the survey may do so by following this link:

This survey is a tool to evaluate the services provided by the BC President's Office and the KCCCD District Office as required by ACCJC Standard IV. This survey should take approximately 5 minutes to complete. Your answers are confidential. The results will be presented by AIQ to Academic Senate and College Council at the end of the semester.

The District Office is working with funding that Bakersfield College secured through an Innovation Award from the state to develop a model research data warehouse that has enhanced capabilities, integrating information from the entire organization (such as Banner, Starfish, eLumen, etc.) and providing snapshots of key data.

At the request of President Christian, AIQ is developing for Spring 2019 and the longer term a plan to improve our institutional metric for transfer level math completion. We are working to gain input from groups including math faculty, psychology faculty, curriculum, and enrollment management. We will present that plan at College Council on November 16th.
