Instructional Unit Requirements

- ❖ Must meet essential workforce training, or specialized lab settings and/or SLO's can't be attained in virtual setting
- ❖ Course Attestation Form Completion for each individual course
- ❖ Zoom Orientation Meetings with students and faculty – discussed shared responsibilities
- ❖ COVID – 19 Training videos – 7 short videos discussing COVID-19, wearing a mask, handwashing, prevention measures
- ❖ Must wear face masks at all times while on campus
- ❖ Health Requirements prior to entrance into class
 - ❖ Temperature checks

- ❖ Sanitation Measures – M&O and Instructional Unit Responsibilities

On-campus Activity – Instructional

❖ Instructional Units

❖ Approximately 27 sections of Courses that are strictly Face to Face

- ❖ Short-term courses that are only specialized laboratory training
 - ❖ CPR courses, Fire/EMT Paramedic lab courses, Westec

❖ Approximately 122 sections of courses that have a Face to Face Lab Requirement

- ❖ Instructional Areas
 - ❖ Nursing, Rad Tech, Paramedic, EMT, Ag, Industrial Tech, Engineering Systems, Culinary, Performing Arts
- ❖ Some courses are scheduled as re-occurring and others as “Events”

❖ Student Enrollment – Approximately 2000

- ❖ Approximately 30 sections per day are on-campus
- ❖ Approximately 400-500 students per day are on campus

Non-instructional Unit Requirements

- ❖ Discovered that there were more employees working on campus than we originally knew about
- ❖ Essential Workforce Areas – not required to complete Attestation Form, but must adhere to health requirements and sanitation
 - ❖ Public Safety, IT, M&O, Student Health Center
- ❖ Non-essential Units must complete the Non-instructional Unit Attestation Form if conducting business on campus
- ❖ COVID – 19 Training videos – 7 short videos discussing COVID-19, wearing a mask, handwashing, prevention measures
- ❖ Must wear face masks at all times while on campus
- ❖ Health Requirements upon arrival to campus at Student Health Center
 - ❖ Temperature checks

- ❖ Sanitation Measures – M&O and Unit Responsibilities

On-campus Activity – Noninstructional

- ❖ Events versus Scheduled Working on campus
 - ❖ Library – Book check out, Student Life – Pantry, Outreach – Renegade Cards, IT – Chromebook Checkout
 - ❖ Office of Instruction, Inmate Education, Business Services
 - ❖ Child Development Center
- ❖ If employees are coming into work – the Unit must complete a Non-instructional Attestation Form
- ❖ Hosting off-campus Swim Groups
 - ❖ Required to follow Industry Guidelines and submit their Attestation/COVID-19 Plan to College
 - ❖ Orientation Zoom Meetings with Coaches/Parents/Swimmers completed

Tracking COVID-19

- ❖ Zero on-campus exposures to date
- ❖ Currently tracking 4 COVID exposures
 - ❖ 2 + Healthcare students who were exposed at their places of employment
 - ❖ 2 Healthcare student's possible exposures through clinical setting – determined to not be an exposure
 - ❖ 2 other students exposed outside of class – 14-day isolation
 - ❖ 1 Contract Education course may have a potential instructor exposure – waiting on more information
- ❖ Need every Manager on campus to help enforce the requirements – need to ensure that we are role modeling wearing masks, cleaning of work areas and health checks
 - ❖ This is not the time to relax – COVID-19 is still prevalent in our Community, but we are also entering cold and flu season.
