- Enrollment at BC for fall 2020 is 5.6% lower than the same time last fall which is a **457.07 FTES decrease** this fall over last fall.



Data Snippet: Improving Equity in "On-Path" Percentage

Since introducing the Program Pathways Mapper, BC has improved students' "on-path" percentage, indicating improved access to program maps combined with improved advising supports like the introduction of Starfish has advanced our equity agenda. Among students pursuing an ADT, white students increased their on-path percentage by 11 percentage points while Black students increased by 15 percentage points and Latinx students increase by 18 percentage points.

Following a video premiere of <u>Project HireUp: A Community Collaborative to End</u> <u>Homelessness</u> on Thursday, October 15, 14 students graduated with a certificate of achievement from Project HireUp's Homeless to a Job program on Friday, October 16. Here is some data on Project HireUp's success so far:

- <u>Cohort #1</u>- 24 students completed a certificate; 6 students gained employment with Adventist Health
- <u>Cohort #2</u>- 14 completed a certificate and 8 students have gained employment so far




Latina Leaders of Kern

The 36th annual Shakespeare festival kicked off last week with the virtual premiere of "The Comedy of Errors," directed by Bob Kempf. The performers have adapted the slapstick of the Bard's original "Comedy of Errors" into a Chaplinesque silent film with masks. Performances of the play aired online Thursday, October 22 through Saturday, October 24.

For the first time at this year's Kern Shakespeare Festival, the theater department will begin premiering a production alongside the Shakespeare plays that were created by playwrights of color. Premiering Thursday, October 29 is a performance of "Bootycandy," a semiautobiographical play written by Robert O'Hara and premiered in 2015. The festival closes out starting November 5th with Shakespeare's "The Tempest", the centerpiece of this year's theme of "O Brave New World".
