AB 1111 Overview

October 18th is the next meeting of the AB 1111. They will be going over the Draft Report and then finalize the implementation plan at the December 7th meeting. Items in the report include: key definitions, alignment of Common Course Numbering Descriptor Elements, Proposed Taxonomy, Data Reconciliation Project, and funding for implementation.

AB 928 Overview

Two groups working on AB 928 issues: [AB 928 Associate Degree for Transfer Intersegmental Implementation Committee](#) and Intersegmental Committee of the Academic Senates (ICAS). ICAS is focusing on Cal-GETC and the AB 928 Committee is focusing on overall implementation. Goals of the AB 928 committee include: decreasing excess units, eliminating repetition of courses, increasing number of students who transfer, proposing a new unit threshold for STEM degree pathways, and reengaging ADT earners who do not transfer. More information in the Draft of Final Report Elements that will be approved at the November 30 Meeting. ICAS is working on a new Version of Cal-GETC to update Areas 2, 3, 4, and 5. Notable items in Cal-GETC Version 1.0 include: Courses must be CSU and UC transferable, CLEP is not allowed, Area 6 may use either CSU or UC requirements, Area 1 must be taught in English, All Area 1C will be "resubmitted", new AP and IB tables, Credit By Exam must be equivalent to "C" or better, Ethnic Studies can be cross-listed, CSUs will individually evaluate American Institutions (AI) requirements, UCs will individually evaluate Language other than English (LOTE) requirements, and "grandfathering" in with random checks for those courses will occur.

GE Team Review
