The course provides the theoretical knowledge needed to provide care to women planning a family; in the antepartum, intrapartum, and postpartum periods; and newborns in the first few days of life. The laboratory component of the course will be completed in maternal newborn units of our local hospital partners and in the BC nursing simulation laboratory.
