

Generative Artificial Intelligence

 Increase with equity the number of students attending a California community college, with particular emphasis on the number of underserved Californians.

Equity in Access

- Increase with equity the number of California Community
 Colleges students receiving state and federal aid for which they are eligible to better support their educational journey.
- Decrease the number of units in excess of 60 units for the Associate Degree for Transfer.

Equity in Support

- Increase with equity the number of California Community College students:
 - Who complete a meaningful educational outcome.
 - Who attain a baccalaureate degree.
 - Who earn a living wage.

Credit for Prior Learning

CCR Section 55050

For purposes of this section, "assessment" means the process that faculty undertake with a student to ensure the student demonstrates sufficient mastery of the course outcomes as set forth in the course outline of record.

The nature and content of the assessment **shall be determined solely by faculty** in the discipline who normally teach the course for which credit is to be granted in accordance with policies and procedures approved by the curriculum committee...

The **faculty shall determine** that the assessment adequately measures mastery of the course content as set forth in the outline of record.

The **faculty may accept** an assessment conducted at a location other than the community college for this purpose.

Data Reporting Requirements

- Every 3 years review CPL policy
- Findings:
 - Gender
 - Race/ethnicity
 - Number of students who received CPL
 - Number of credits awarded per student
 - Retention and persistence rates
 - Completion data
 - "Qualitative assessments by students of the policies and procedures"



Baccalaureate Degree Program

Faculty and Academic Senates are key partners engaged at all levels of community college baccalaureate degree program development and approval.



Authorities and Overview

- Authorizes the Board to establish up to 30 baccalaureate degree programs during 2 application periods, annually.
- College application submissions deadlines:
 - January 15 (approval/rejection by May 31)
 - August 15 (approval/rejection by December 31).
- The Chancellor ensures the application and review process meets statutory requirements
- The Chancellor ensures intersegmental consultation with CSU, UC and AICCU.



Application Approval Stages

Full Approval

- Policy compliant
- Passing program quality score
- Intersegmental agreement
- ACCJC approval
- BOG approval

Conditional Approval

- Policy compliant
- Passing program quality score
- Intersegmental agreement
- Pending:
 - BOG and/or ACCJC Approval

Provisional Approval

- Policy compliant
- Passing program quality score
- Pending:
 - ACCJC approval &/or intersegmental agreement; and BOG approval

Resubmission

- Is not policy compliant
- Does not have a passing program quality score

Intersegmental Program Review

Proposed programs will be reviewed through one of these methods:

- Full Review New program considered for the first time
- Streamlined Review Proposed program that is the same as previously approved community college programs
- Expedited Review Clear career technical education or applied degrees that are not in CSU or UC's wheelhouse and were previously approved

Intersegmental Program Review: Key Elements

From the program duplication rubric from ICAS:

- CIP Codes
- Program Name, Description, and Outcomes*
- Course Details*
- Program accreditation*
- Intended industry licensure or certification
- Lower division major prep
- Concentrations

NOT INCLUDED:

- Lower division courses
- Minors and certificates
- Upper division general education
- Method of instruction



Intersegmental Program Review: Establishing Agreement

- The segments will come to an agreed upon conclusion before community college baccalaureate degree programs are approved.
- For written agreement, duplication objections has been rescinded based on one of the following:
 - Shared agreement that there is not sufficient evidence of program duplication
 - Curricular revise and resubmit: Documented changes to the proposed curriculum to eliminate duplication
 - Potential opportunities to collaborate to ensure student need is met
