

Advanced Placement (AP) Program

Advanced Placement is a program of college-level courses and exams for high school students. Bakersfield College grants college credit for students who score a three or higher on Advanced Placement exams. Additional information may be obtained from the Office of Admissions and Records in the Administration building or by email to BCrecords@kccd.edu. *A score of 3, 4, or 5 is required for credit in any given courses.*

Students may submit a Request for Evaluation forms to the Office of Admissions and Records in the Administration building, room 107 or email the completed form to BCrecords@kccd.edu after they have enrolled at Bakersfield College once they have submitted their official scores from College Board to Bakersfield College, and they must have appropriate documentation of their successful completion of the Advanced Placement courses. A maximum of 30 units of credit by examination may be applied to the Associate Degree. Upon receipt of a completed Request for Evaluation form and official transcripts from College Board, transcripts will be reviewed within a 24-week waiting period. The rRequest for Evaluation form is only held in the Admissions and Records of Office for 630 days, if no official transcript is received within 630 days, the request form will be disposed of safely.

Note: *Advanced Placement Exams that satisfy UC and CSU requirements should be checked for currency and specific college credit. Course equivalency is neither automatic nor guaranteed upon transfer.*

**CSU - If a student passes more than one AP exam in Calculus, only one examination may be applied to the baccalaureate. UC - Maximum credit: 5.3 semester units both MATH AB and BC exams. UC - Maximum credit: 2.6 semester units for both the MATH AB and the AB Subscore.

***UC - Maximum credit: 5.3 semester units for both English Language and Composition and Literature and Composition.

****CSU - If a student passes more than on AP exam in Physics, only 6 units of credit may be applied to the baccalaureate, and only 4 units of credit may be applied to a certification in GE Breadth. UC - Maximum credit: 5.3 semester units for all Physics exams.
