Topics will be covered to prepare students to safely and effectively operate aerial apparatus, with a focus on meeting the requirements recommended by the Statewide Training and Education Advisory Committee (STEAC) and the State Board of Fire Services (SBFS). These standards have been adopted by the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM), ensuring students are prepared for certification and real-world application. In many cases, this will be the fire fighter's first exposure to live structural fire fighting. The structures used in class are generally donated buildings with a written agreement between the owner and the authority having jurisdiction (AHJ) specifying the live fire training that will be conducted and acknowledges the expected condition of the structure upon completion of the training. Avoiding situations that could cause you to become lost, trapped, or injured is the best way to prevent tragedies at a fire scene. Topics include fire fighter survival terminology, developing a survival attitude, increasing situational awareness, and being trained in problem-solving techniques so you can become more self-reliant in an emergency.
