Articulation Overview

Definition of “Articulation”

- From CIAC Handbook, 2013
 - The process of developing a formal, written agreement that identifies courses (or sequences of courses) on a “sending” campus that are comparable to, or acceptable in lieu of, specific course requirements at a “receiving” campus.



Role of the Articulation Officer (AO)

- Serve as an advocate
- Be a well-informed resources
- Disseminate current, accurate, articulation data
- Serve on appropriate campus committees
- Serve as a consultant
- Facilitate campus participation in intersegmental programs
- Monitor each stage of the articulation process
- Manage and update campus articulation data (ASSIST, Banner, eLumen, etc)
- Review courses and program for transfer, general education, GD, etc requirements
- Serve as a proactive agent
- Initiate faculty-approved articulation agreements
- Serve as a moderator and mediator
- Serve as a campus liaison



Transferability

CSU Transfer Guidelines

- CSU Transferability was delegated to CCC by [CSU Executive Order 167](#) and later defined in “[What Constitutes a Baccalaureate Level Course](#)”.
 - (1) a clear emphasis on cultural, historic, aesthetic, or other intellectual facets of the subject taught – particularly in classes that otherwise would amount to skills development;
 - (2) stated requirements in reading and writing;
 - (3) high demands of students, substantial student-faculty interaction, and clearly distinguished entry- and exit- level expectations; and
 - (4) the existence of comparable courses at four-year institutions.



UC Transfer Guidelines

- [UC Transferability](#) is reviewed externally by UCOP
 - Should be comparable to lower-division course at a UC Campus
 - Specific Regulations by Subject Area
- UCs requires textbooks to be published within seven years of review (due to processing time, we require 5 years or newer)
- Must be re-submitted if “Substantial Changes” occur

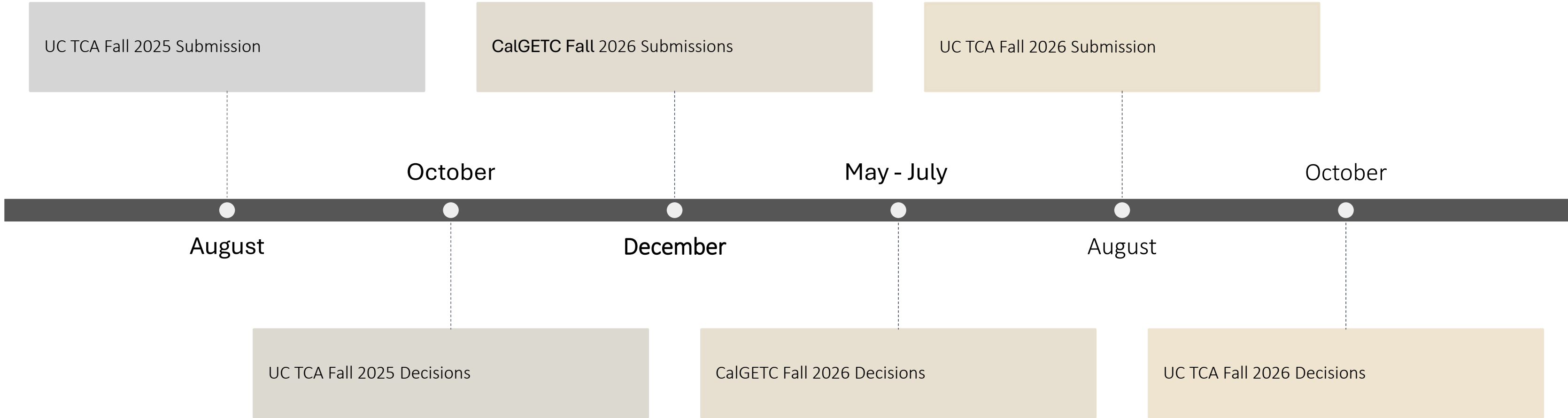


Cal-GETC Guidelines

- UC TCA required for Cal-GETC consideration
- Cal-GETC is reviewed externally
 - Effective the following Fall
 - No Appeals
 - Two-level independent Review
- Governed by the [Cal-GETC Standards](#)

 - Areas of Focus
 - Description
 - SLOs
 - Assignment

Common Course Numbering Project

- [CCCCCO Common Course Numbering Project](#)
- Phase I (Fall 2025), Phase Ia (Fall 2026 start), Phase Ib (Fall 2027 start), Phase III (Fall 2027 start – scheduled)
- Originally, articulation and transfer were supposed to be agreed upon at the template level
- Currently, all courses must be resubmitted for UC TCA and CaGETC
- Required elements of the COR
- More changes and revisions coming
- CCN does not always align with GID (not resubmitting until told to do so by CCCCCO)

C-ID and ADTs

What is C-ID?

- Course Identification Numbering System (CID)
- Undergo 5-year reviews by a Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG)
- Initiated by a Discipline Input Group (DIG)
- A C-ID Descriptor is the Bare Minimum
 - Course Description
 - Content Outline
 - Objectives/Outcomes
 - Textbooks/Materials
- C-ID, CSU GE, IGETC, UC TCA, C-ID, C-ID, CCN, course articulation, major articulation are all independent

- TMCs (Transfer Model Curricula) [Approved and Reviewed by CCCCO](#)
- Courses Can Only Be Added by:
 - C-ID
 - AAM – Articulation Agreement by Major
 - GECC – General Education Certification Course
 - BCT – Baccalaureate Course
 - Use Articulation System Stimulating Intersegmental Student Transfer [\(ASSIST\)](#)



What are ADTs?

- Associate Degree for Transfer
- Can be an AAT or AS-T
- Must be on the CCCCCO Approved ADT list
- Uses a TMC
