• Chair Reports

- Faculty (Tunson)- asked committee to share any information they would like included in upcoming end of year report to academic senate in regards to the faculty diversification project.
- Administrator (Guzman)- Shared the importance of the committee and keeping the momentum going through the summer and for next year. Thanked the committee for all the work accomplished.

• Subcommittee Reports

- Commitment 1 (Guzman)- Shared on the importance of ethnic studies department for minority students.
- o Commitment 2 (Coffee)
 - USC eConvenings (Guzman)- spots are still available for upcoming econvenings. Encouraged committee to reach out if interested in participating.
 - Equity Forum Debrief and Next Steps (Coffee)- Shared on last 2 forums, an important quote from student. First forum there was over 90 attendees, second panel did not have as high attendance, but faculty shared tips and take-aways from the conversation with students. Next panel will be administrative panel led by Richard McCrow. (*J. Hill?*)
 - Coffee stated that committee will be requesting a call for presentation for opening week and other activities.
- Commitment 3 (Pimentel-Stratton)- committee recently met and discussed the mission to move forward. Lily stated she was recently appointed to lead this subcommittee and is learning.
- o Guzman shared that finalizing the EEO plan will help guide the work of the committee from a district level.

- o Bond and Zikri discussed the need for proper evaluation for equivalency.

- O Zikri shared that there was a request for discipline expert..
- Guzman recommended adding to bullet number 5 in the document to include process.
