Due to understaff 300+ of over-time hours have been put in (1) month total by our Public Safety Officers.

Students are dispatching with 2 different radios, 1 for the carts and 1 for officers. These calls are high stress and students due to maturity level can only handle so much. There are times students miss information, and there are times officers are put in serious situations blind-sided. This campus is huge 31,000 + still growing. Public Safety Director will be putting something together to get more staff and get a better system going.

1997 – 13,000 students

2018 Present- 31,000 students and the BC Public Safety Department staff # remains the same, only had 1 fulltime body increase in 21 years.

Increase in Public Safety needs to happen, due to all these incidents that are happening around us, let's be proactive and not wait till something happen.
